Travel Tip

- Ship items before you go & on your return
- Take pictures of box contents with digital camera
- Take pictures of whiteboards or slides in conferences instead of writing them down



Digital Camera Gear



- PCMCIA or PC Card
- Eliminates camera cable
- Faster transfer rate
- Saves camera battery



External Hard Drive



FireFly by SmartDisk

- Use as a boot disk
- Great for backup
- No power brick required



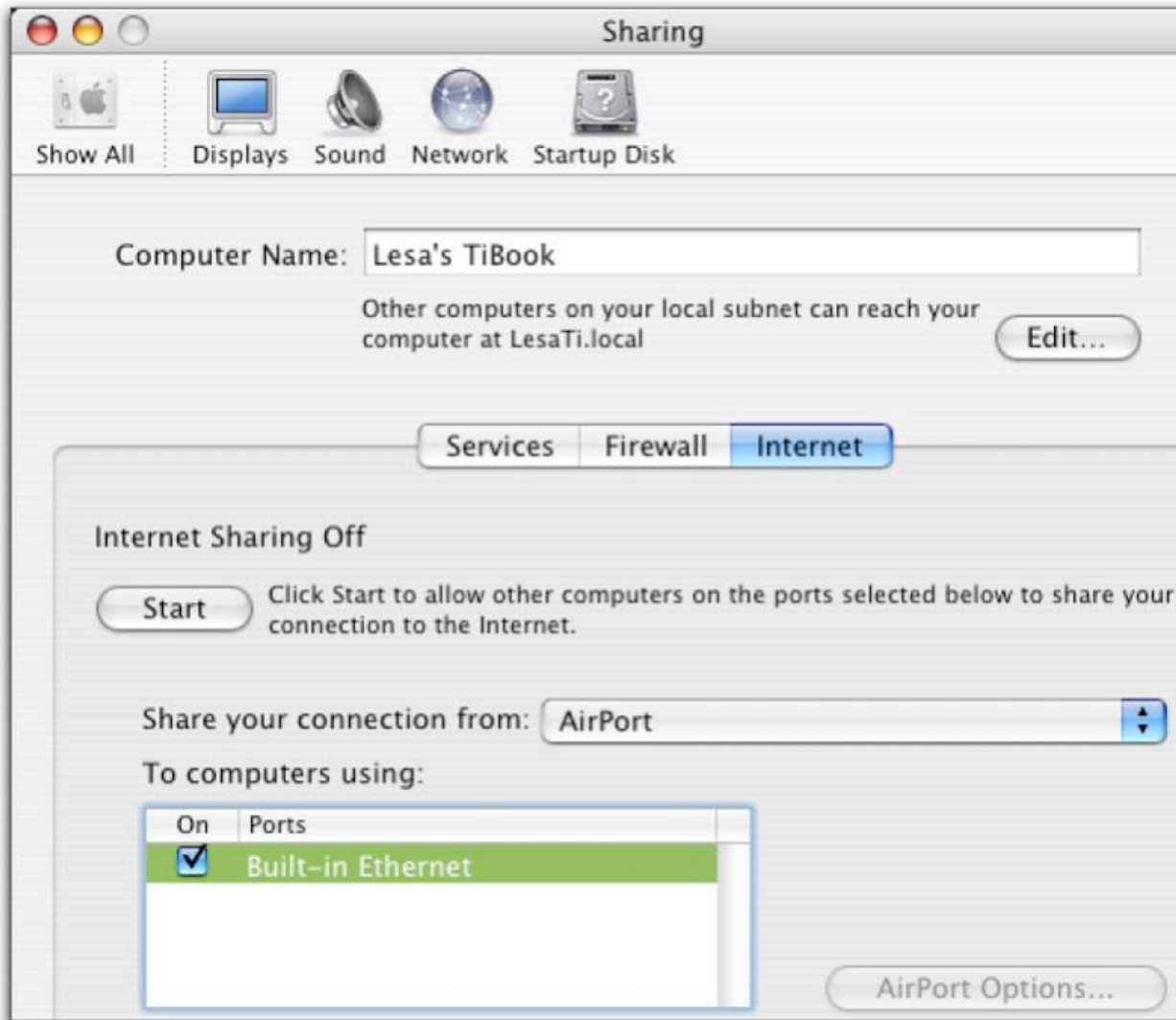
AirPort Express



- Converts any Ethernet connection to wireless
- Extend signal from base station
- May have to turn authentication off in email client



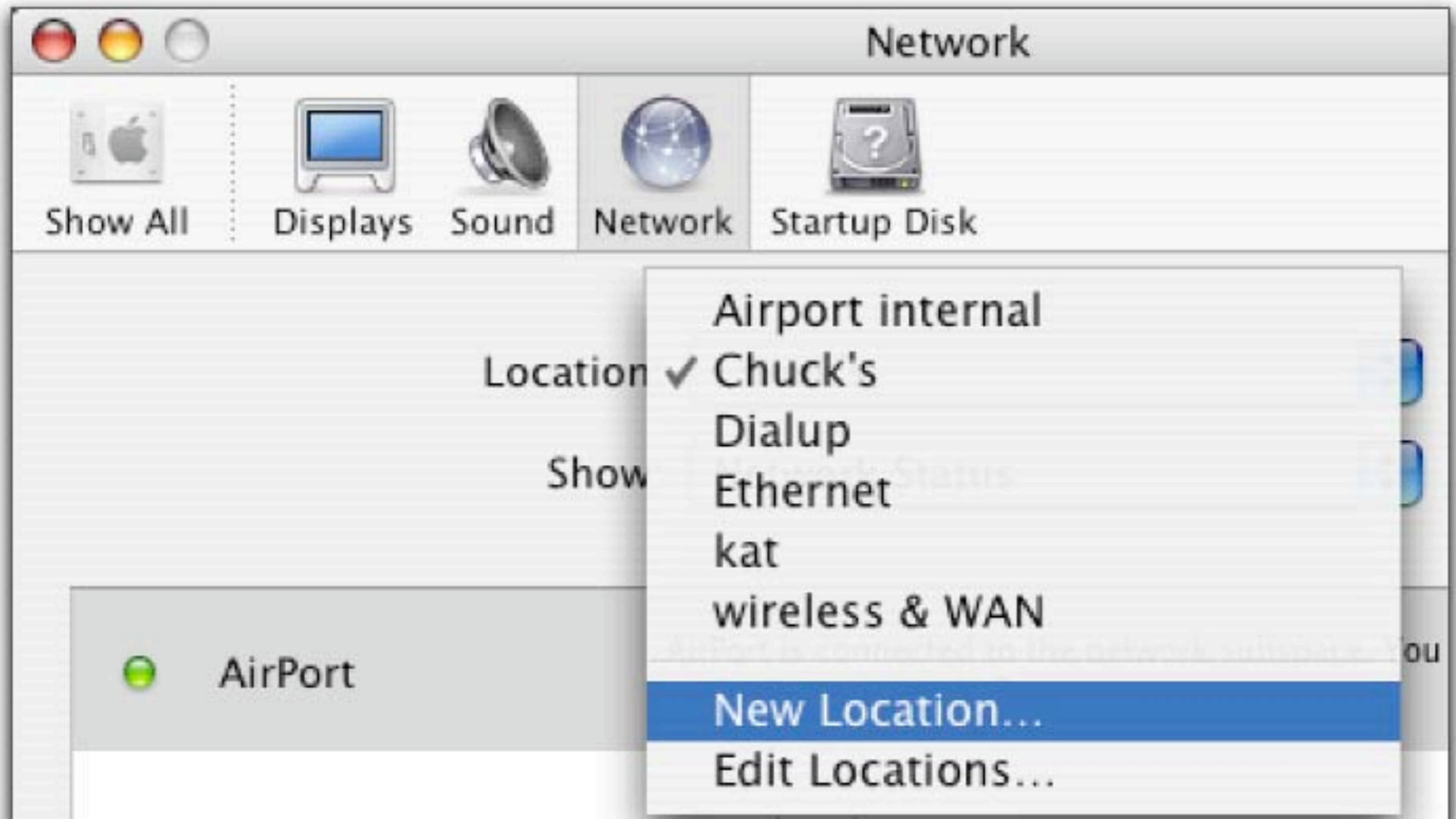
Travel Tip



- Learn to share your internet connection

Travel Tip

- As an alternative to retractable cables, use plastic baggies.
- Helps keep things orderly, labeled, and serves as checklist when packing up.
- Use ziplocks, punch small holes in to allow air to escape and let them flatten out.

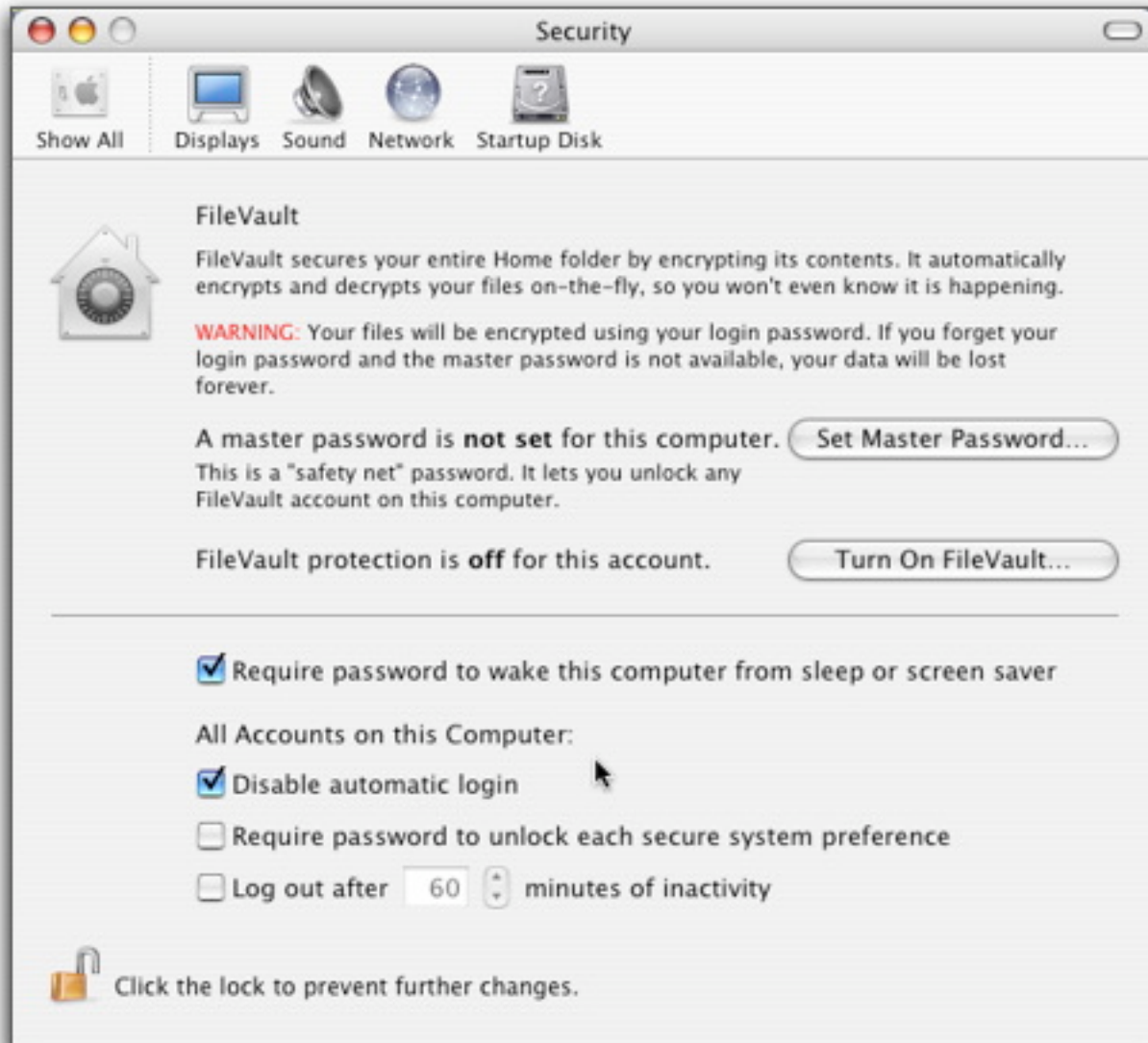

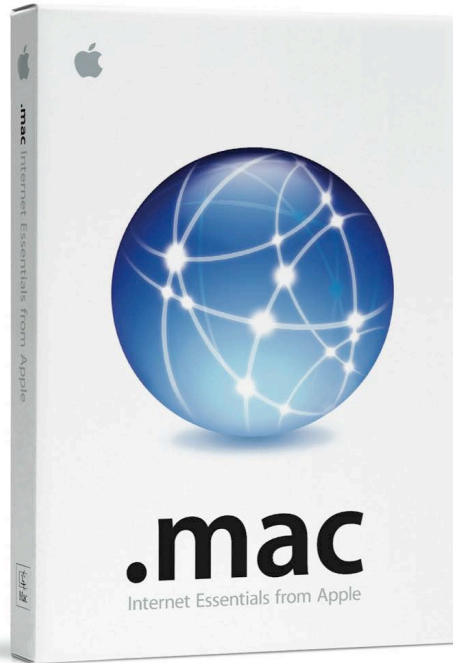


- Keep prying eyes out

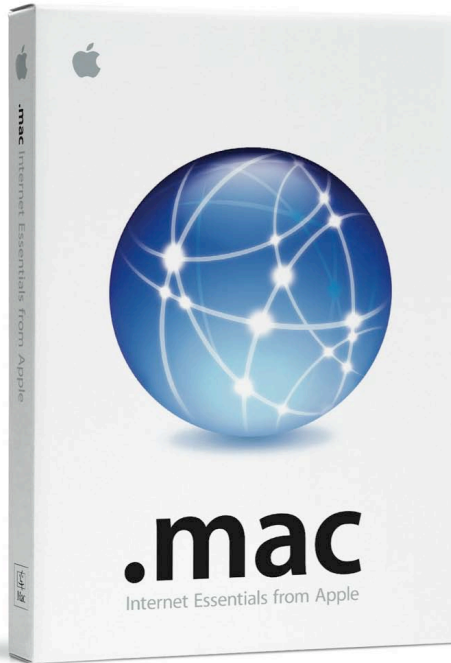
.Mac Account



- Web-based email
- Publishing and sharing photos and videos
- Sharing & file transfer with iDisk



.Mac Account



- Online storage with iDisk
- Password based outgoing mail



Travel Tip

- Make your PowerBook your main email machine
- Set your email to be left on your server before you leave for duration of trip



Internet Access



- Local access numbers
- 800 #



Travel Tip

- Do you *really* need high speed for an overnight stay?
- Find out how much outgoing calls (including 800 numbers) cost, if there is a per-minute charge, and if there is a “block” of time.
- Check email in the shower with AOL



Internet Access



- Wireless access
- Beware of pay plan



Travel Tip

- Get a special, low-limit credit card to use only for online access instead of your debit card.



Phone access



- A virtual calling card
- Affordable rates—2.5 - 2.9¢ per minute
- Online call log



Fax service



- Free up to 20 pages every 30 days
- \$12.95 (USD) per month
- \$139.95 (USD) per year for Plus service

- Clone your hard drive
- Burn essential files to CD or DVD
- Copy essential travel files to your iDisk
- Copy essential travel files to your Flash drive



Backup During Trip



- Burn essential files to CD or DVD
- Copy updated files to your iDisk
- Email files to yourself at an address you don't pick up.
